We started our programme in June with a Coach Tour to the National Trust's Mount Stewart House and its beautiful gardens before heading to The Somme



Heritage Centre. The centre examines Ireland's role in the First World War with special reference to the cross-community involvement in the three local volunteer Divisions. Our tour brought us back to 1910, the Home Rule Crisis, recruiting and training of men and life in the trenches. This excellent centre allows the visitor to walk through reconstructed trenches of the Battle of the Somme in 1916. Of course no outing would be complete without an evening meal which we enjoyed at the

The sun shone on Enniskillen in August when our next Coach Tour took us to Castle Coole, Enniskillen Castle and the interactive visitors centre.

This island town has lots of history and charm but a 'must see'

is the Museum of the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers. This museum hosts amazing displays spanning the history of the famous regiment from 1689 to 1968. The Valley Hotel, Fivemiletown was the venue for our morning coffee and our evening meal.

The officers, committee and members of ECDA and all our sub-groups and societies deeply regret the passing of our highly esteemed Secretary and founder member Mr Jim Edgar.

Jim's gentle manner touched everyone in the association in which he worked tirelessly. We had no hesitation in nominating Jim Edgar for the Mayor's Award in November 2008, an honour he received for services to the community. His many hours of hard work resulted in various successful bids for grants aid aimed at improving the life of our local community.

He was instrumental in the refurbishment of Edenderry Orange Hall allowing it to become a modern venue suitable



for the growing number of community group classes, clubs and societies it now accommodates. From a building with one meeting hall, outdated kitchen and inadequate toilet facilities, it now boasts a function hall, meeting room, well proportioned kitchen and modern toilets with disabled facilities.

Jim was one of the driving forces behind the new arch in Edenderry

and put many hours into ensuring its construction would remain part of the rich culture and heritage associated with the July celebrations in Portadown. The Arch Committee erected a memorial plate on the arch as a symbol of their appreciation of Jim's faithful work.

A keen and talented artist, exhibiting his paintings in many local exhibitions, Jim es-

tablished an art class in Edenderry and passed on his knowledge to all the budding artists who joined the group. One of the first pieces of work undertaken by the members was based on Jim's own painting of Bachelors Walk in its former glory. He also painted 'Eden Ted', the Mums and Tots mascot, so that he could teach his students and help Edentots raise funds by raffling his work. The art class appreciated the patient work of their friend and mentor.

Last year the Royal British Legion and ECDA hosted a Festival of Remembrance in Portadown Town Hall. Once again Jim was the driving force in its organisation. This event will be repeated this year and those associated with its plan-

ning are missing Jim's input but are determined to make it the success Jim always envisaged.

In acknowledgement of his lifelong interest in the British Forces, donations in lieu of flowers were for the charity Help for Heroes.

In recognition of Jim's service and friendship to ECDA, the group unanimously decided to take a retiring collection for Help for Heroes at every event, class, lecture and outing we organise this year.

Jim will be greatly missed and has left a lasting void in Edenderry. We pass on our sincere heartfelt sympathy to his wife Merle, children Alison, Joan and Geoffrey, sons-in-law, daughter-in-law, his much loved grandchildren and the wider family circle.

We also wish to express our sincere sympathy to Mr Eric Dale, Chairperson, Edenderry Cultural and Historical Society on the death of his mother Mrs Elsie Dale. Mrs Dale was best known for running two businesses in the Edenderry area of Portadown. Along with her husband, Jack, she set up a 'corner shop' at Edenderry, which also served teas and she later had a small bed and breakfast business on the same premises.

In 1966 they moved to Watson Street where they established the Rockeden Guest House with 11 bedrooms, which Mrs Dale ran until 1979. Mrs Dale is also survived by daughter Evelyn, son John, sister Florrie, seven grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

A WEEK IN EDENDERRY



The Edenderry Community Development Association was formed in March 2004 by residents and former residents of the area, with the aim of improving the knowledge of the public by giving them greater involvement in the wider community and promoting awareness of history, folklore and the cultural heritage of the area.

We were established to benefit the people of the greater Edenderry area regardless of class, creed or other opinion. As our base is in Edenderry Orange Hall in Bridge Street most of our activities take place there. Whilst we have made good progress in reaching out to our community we feel we should promote ourselves, and our sub-groups, with greater enthusiasm.

As with most clubs and societies September marks the start of another year's endeavours and we have a full list of forthcoming events

in the centrefold of this newsletter but I would like to give you a brief background of each activity including new ventures funded by a generous £10,000 grant from Awards for All.



MONDAY evenings are reserved for art classes. Under the guidance of Mrs Hazel Busby and her equally qualified friend Jennifer, we extend a welcome to complete novices, improvers and more experienced members alike.

These classes start on the 28th September at 7pm and will run for

ten weeks. Edenderry Community Development Association aim to provide our classes at a reasonable cost and £20 gets you 10 weeks tuition and a 'wee cup of tea'. Come along and

with the Society members eight volunteers are involved in the project and its research.

The first project undertaken by the society was a remarkable success with major funding of £43,000 from the Lottery Heritage Fund allowing the group to research and record the history of the local Wade factory.

The fourth **Wednesday** of each month sees

the meeting of Edenderry Business and Residents Association. This group promotes and encourages the regeneration of the greater Edenderry area. They liaise with statutory bodies and relevant organisations to help solve issues identified by the residents and businesses in the area. A proactive role is taken in safety, traffic, health and environmental issues in the area.

The group have achieved a lot of what others would see as small things – such as introducing street signage, seeing that the road drainage system is clear and securing access to derelict sites. They have also had numerous meetings with various parties about the VICO development which we feel would put the life back into Edenderry's landscape.

THURSDAY is the busiest day of our week! In the morning, 10.30 to noon, the parent and toddler group meets.

This year Eden Tots have decided to limit their numbers to fifteen tots and their minders per session.

By doing this they aim to provide a cosy, personal environment where the children can feel comfortable in their surroundings and the adults can have a chat whilst keeping a close eye on their little ones. Our fully subscribed computer class takes place on **Thursday** afternoons at the same time as



the Caroline Robinson Ballet School hold their classes in the main hall.

The Belly Dance Group meets on **Thursday** evenings from 8-9pm. This is a fun exercise group with the main emphasis being on the fun! It is open to everyone regardless of shape, size or age, and you don't need expose your 'belly' to take part!

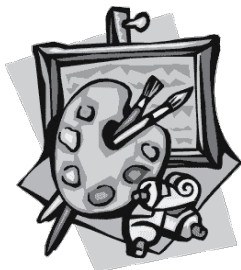
